

Speaker Biographies



Barry DuVal
President & CEO
Virginia Chamber of Commerce

Barry DuVal was named president and CEO of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce on April 28, 2010.

Under his leadership, the Chamber has become Virginia's largest business advocacy group, growing from 847 members in 2010 to more than 26,000 members today. In 2013, the Chamber produced Blueprint Virginia – the Commonwealth's first comprehensive business-led initiative to provide direction and long-term economic development planning for Virginia. In 2017, the Chamber released an update to the original Blueprint, Blueprint Virginia 2025, which engaged over 6,000 business and community leaders from around the Commonwealth to build an action plan for strengthening Virginia's economic competitiveness and getting Virginia back to the top of business climate rankings.

Barry's public service began in 1988 when he was elected to the Newport News City Council. In 1990 he was elected mayor of the city. He served as mayor from 1990 through 1996, when he stepped down to become the president and CEO of a regional economic development organization representing Southeast Virginia's 1.6 million citizens.

From 1998 through 2002 Barry served as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade for the Commonwealth of Virginia. During his term as Secretary, Virginia attracted a record-setting 1,500 economic development projects representing 156,850 new jobs and \$13.7 billion in private investment.

His private sector experience includes serving as president and CEO of DuVal Associates, Inc., a diversified real estate firm, from 1983-1996. Upon the completion of his term as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, he served as president and CEO of Kaufman & Canoles Consulting, LLC, an economic development consulting firm specializing in public-private partnerships and strategic planning for business and government agencies.

Barry holds a Master of Legal Studies (MLS) degree from American University Washington College of Law and a Bachelor of Science degree from James Madison University.



The Honorable Craig Crenshaw Secretary of Veterans and Defense Affairs Office of Governor Glenn Youngkin

Craig Crenshaw has over 30 years of leading robust logistics products and services across a global network. He served as the president of Claxton Logistics Services. He spent many years in leadership roles in the United States Marine Corps and retired as a Major General. Craig served as the Senior Executive of Logistics and Supply Chain Management, and prior to that he was the Director of Manpower Management for the United States Marine Corps.

Craig also served as the Commanding General of Marine Corps Logistics Command and the Director of Logistics Plans and Policy for the United States Marine Corps. Additionally, he served as the Vice Director for Logistics at the Joint Chiefs of Staffs.

Craig received his B.A. in Political Science from Southern University and A&M College. In addition, he has an M.A. from Webster University and an M.S. from the Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy.

Andrew Warren is Military / Veteran Affairs and Public Policy Senior Advisor for Dominion Energy.

Mr. Warren earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the Virginia Military Institute, is a graduate of the Marine Corps University Command and Staff College and holds a Master of Business Administration from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Kenan-Flagler Business School. He is a graduate of the LEAD Virginia class of 2021.

Prior to joining Dominion Energy in 2021, Drew completed 26 years of public service to the United States in multiple national security roles. As a career Marine Corps infantry officer, he completed seven overseas deployments, five of which involved direct combat operations in Kosovo, Iraq, and Afghanistan. Colonel Michael Brooks

Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Base Quantico United States Marine Corps

Colonel Michael L. Brooks is a native of South Boston, VA. He enlisted into the Marine Corps in August 1988 out of Parris Island, S.C. Upon graduation, Colonel Brooks was assigned to Third Battalion, 2d Marines, 2d Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, N.C. as the operations clerk in the S-3 office. Between 1990 and 1991, while still assigned to 3dBn, 2dMar, he deployed in support of Operations DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM. In the summer of 1992, then Corporal Brooks was assigned to Officer Candidates School, Quantico, VA and in 1994, Sergeant Brooks was assigned to Marine Corps Combat Service Support School, Camp Johnson, NC. In August 1997, Sergeant Brooks was commissioned a 2d Lieutenant through the Meritorious Commissioning Program. After the completion of The Basic School and the Adjutant's course in 1998, 2dLt Brooks was assigned to 2d Marine Regiment, 2d Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, NC., as the Regimental Adjutant. In March 2001, 2dLt Brooks participated in Cooperative Osprey 2001; a multinational North Atlantic Treaty Organization Command Post Exercise, in Clementsport, Nova Scotia. Prior to finishing his tour with 2d Marines, he obtained a bachelor of science in psychology from Campbell University.

In June 2001, he reported to Marine Air Control Group 28 in Cherry Point, NC, as the Group Adjutant and Legal Officer. In June 2003, Captain Brooks was assigned to the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU), II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, NC as the MEU Adjutant. While assigned to the 24th MEU, Captain Brooks deployed to Iraq in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM II, participated in Humanitarian Operations following Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans, LA, assisted in the July 2006 evacuation of American Citizens in Beirut, Lebanon, and participated in operations INFINITE MOONLIGHT, Jordan, and INSPIRED UNION, in Kuwait. From June 2007 to June 2009, Captain Brooks was assigned to the Wounded Warrior Regiment as the U.S. Marine Corps' Liaison to the Veterans Affairs Central Office in Washington, D.C..

In June 2009, Major Brooks was selected to be the Staff Secretary for the Deputy Commandant, Combat Development and Integration, Marine Corps Combat Development Command, Quantico, VA. In 2011, Major Brooks attended Resident Command and Staff College in Quantico, VA and upon graduation in 2012, was assigned to U.S. Central Command, Tampa, FL as the Branch Chief, Special Actions Branch – J-1.

In June 2015, LtCol Brooks was selected and assigned as the Headquarters Battalion Commanding Officer at Marine Corps Base Hawaii. Upon graduation in 2018, he was assigned as the AC/S, G-1 for 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Okinawa, Japan.

Colonel Brooks' personal decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service medal, Meritorious Service medal (3d award), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation medal (5th award), Joint Service Achievement medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement medal (3d award), and the Combat Action ribbon. Captain Matt Frauenzimmer Commanding Officer, Naval Support Activity Hampton Roads United States Navy

A native of San Clemente, Calif., and the son of a Marine Corps Infantry Officer, Captain Matt Frauenzimmer graduated with merit from the United States Naval Academy in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science in History. His education also includes a Master of Science in Global Leadership from the University of San Diego School of Business, and Joint Professional Military Education from the U.S. Naval War College.

His operational assignments include initial and department head service with the World Watchers of Fleet Air Reconnaissance Squadron (VQ) 1; Assistant Operations Officer aboard USS Abraham Lincoln; Executive and 80th Commanding Officer of the Grey Knights of Patrol Squadron (VP) 46; and Assistant Chief of Staff for Operations, Plans, and Training for Carrier Strike Group (CSG) TWO aboard USS Dwight D. His shore assignments include overseas assignments in Japan as the Current and Assistant Operations Officer for Commander, Task Force (CTF) 57/72 where he detached frequently to the Arabian Gulf; Aide and Executive Assistant to the Commanding General, Joint Task Force (JTF) Civil Support, U.S. Northern Command; Requirements Officer to the OPNAV staff for Naval Airborne Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance systems (N2/N6); and Assistant Chief of Staff for Plans, War Fighting Assessments, and the Chief Information Officer for Commander Patrol and Reconnaissance Group. He assumed command of NSA Hampton Roads in July of 2021 and carefully navigated the command through the end of the COVID pandemic.

He leads a geographically diverse installation spread across three municipalities and two states while providing premier customer service to Navy, Joint Service, and NATO headquarters commands comprised of 46 General and Flag Officers. Captain Frauenzimmer has received numerous personal awards, including the 2016 Navy and Marine Corps Leadership Award.
