Barry DuVal President & CEO Virginia Chamber of Commerce

Barry DuVal was named president and CEO of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce on April 28, 2010.

Under his leadership, the Chamber has become Virginia's largest business advocacy group, growing from 847 members in 2010 to more than 32,000 members today. In 2013, the Chamber produced *Blueprint Virginia* – the Commonwealth's first comprehensive business-led initiative to provide direction and long-term economic development planning for Virginia. In 2017, the Chamber released an update to the original Blueprint, *Blueprint Virginia 2025*, which engaged over 6,000 business and community leaders from around the Commonwealth to build an action plan for strengthening Virginia's economic competitiveness and getting Virginia back to the top of business climate rankings.

Barry's public service began in 1988 when he was elected to the Newport News City Council. In 1990 he was elected mayor of the city. He served as mayor from 1990 through 1996, when he stepped down to become the president and CEO of a regional economic development organization representing Southeast Virginia's 1.6 million citizens.

From 1998 through 2002 Barry served as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade for the Commonwealth of Virginia. During his term as Secretary, Virginia attracted a record-setting 1,500 economic development projects representing 156,850 new jobs and \$13.7 billion in private investment.

His private sector experience includes serving as president and CEO of DuVal Associates, Inc., a diversified real estate firm, from 1983-1996. Upon the completion of his term as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, he served as president and CEO of Kaufman & Canoles Consulting, LLC, an economic development consulting firm specializing in public-private partnerships and strategic planning for business and government agencies.

Barry holds a Master of Legal Studies (MLS) degree from American University Washington College of Law and a Bachelor of Science degree from James Madison University.



Robert Duvall President & CEO, Virginia Natural Gas Chair, Virginia Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors

Robert Duvall serves as president of Virginia Natural Gas. In this role, he is responsible for the safe and reliable delivery of natural gas to over 310,000 customers in southeastern Virginia and the Company's system growth and expansion and community involvement. In addition, Duvall serves as senior vice president of Southern Company Gas and is a member of the Southern Company Gas Management Council. Southern Company Gas is a subsidiary of Southern Company and the parent company of Virginia Natural Gas.

Before assuming his current position, Duvall served as senior vice president of Customer Operations, Safety and Technical Training for Southern Company Gas. In this role, he led the Company's customer experience, work scheduling, safety and technical training operations to deliver an outstanding engagement with customers through uncompromising values of safety, trust, performance and commitment.

In 2020, Robert returned to Virginia, where he served as president from 2014 to 2016, to lead the Company through Covid 19 and to establish the new energy future where natural gas is the foundation fuel. In previous roles, he served in a variety of engineering and operations positions, including as vice president of Operations for Virginia Natural Gas and managing director of Field Operations for Atlanta Gas Light. Duvall joined Southern Company Gas in 1984 as a distribution engineer for Atlanta Gas Light.

A graduate of the Civic Leadership Institute of Hampton Roads Virginia, Duvall has served on numerous charitable and civic boards in both Virginia and Georgia including the Virginia Chamber of Commerce, Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce, Hampton Roads Economic Development Alliance, Georgia One-Call Center and United Way. He also has worked closely with March of Dimes, the Heart Association and Special Olympics.

A native of Irmo, South Carolina, Duvall earned a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from Clemson University. He is a registered professional engineer in the state of Georgia.

Duvall and his wife, Phyllis, reside in Virginia Beach.

The Honorable Winsome Earle-Sears

Lieutenant Governor of Virginia Republican Candidate for Governor

Winsome Earle-Sears, a native of Kingston, Jamaica, immigrated to the United States at the age of six. She is proud to have served in the United States Marine Corps. In addition to her various appointments, she has served as the Vice President of the Virginia State Board of Education; and as a presidential appointee to the US Census Bureau, as co-chair of the African American Committee; and the Advisory Committee on Women Veterans to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

Winsome was first elected in 2002 to a majority Black House of Delegates district, a first for a Republican in Virginia since 1865. She is the first female Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the first Black female elected statewide, and the first naturalized female elected to statewide office. She is also the first female Veteran to be elected to statewide office.

As Lieutenant Governor, Winsome Earle-Sears presides over the Senate when they are in a legislative session and casts the tie-breaking vote. Additionally, the Lieutenant Governor serves on various state boards and commissions: Virginia Tourism Authority, Virginia Military Advisory Council, Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation, The Center for Rural Virginia, Secure and Resilient Commonwealth Panel, as well as serving as the national Secretary of the Aerospace States Association (ASA), and as the Chair of the Virginia chapter of ASA (2023). Her office has been represented on the Virginia Advanced Air Mobility Alliance (VAAMA) since 2022. The Lieutenant Governor is also a Fellow at the Hunt Kean Leadership Institute. Education has been and continues to be a focus of the Lieutenant Governor.

In her efforts to hear from as many Virginians as possible, the Lieutenant Governor has traveled over 28,000 miles across the Commonwealth since coming into office. An often-requested speaker, the Lieutenant Governor has headlined numerous events across the Commonwealth and across the nation.

A former program manager for the Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce and VISTA volunteer, Winsome is a trained electrician and successful businesswoman. However, Winsome is most proud of her community work leading a men's prison ministry and as director of a women's homeless shelter. She holds a B.A. in English with a minor in Economics, and an M.A. in Organizational Leadership, with a concentration in Government. Winsome and her husband, Terence, have two daughters Katia and Janel, in addition to DeJon, and granddaughters Victoria and Faith, who are now looking into the face of God.

He has published widely and serves on the editorial review boards: *The Design Journal* and the *Journal of Product Innovation Management* along with authoring three books on innovation and design. One book, *Innovation and Product Management: A Holistic and Practical Approach to Uncertainty Reduction* - Springer Science & Business Media 2015, has experienced over 70,000 chapter downloads.



Jason El Koubi President & CEO Virginia Economic Development Partnership

Jason El Koubi was named President & CEO of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP) in 2022 after serving as Executive Vice President of the state economic development organization for nearly five years.

Working with a wide variety of partners and stakeholders, Jason leads the development and implementation of a strategic plan for Virginia's economic development that encompasses activities across state government. The plan aims to position Virginia as an economic growth leader among U.S. states while ensuring all regions of the Commonwealth participate in that growth. As part of this work, Jason serves on the leadership team for transformational projects, including Virginia's successful bids for Amazon's HQ2, Micron's semiconductor fab expansion, and LEGO's only U.S. manufacturing operation. Under his leadership, VEDP has helped secure more than 800 economic development projects across every region of Virginia, representing more than 125,000 new, direct jobs and more than \$100 billion in capital investment.

He was previously President and CEO of a regional economic development organization in Louisiana. Under his leadership, the organization delivered a new, nationally competitive economic development program for a nine-parish (county) region following one of the most successful capital campaigns of its kind in the nation.

Prior to that, Jason served as assistant secretary of Louisiana Economic Development (LED), where he led initiatives that helped secure record levels of economic development, while dramatically improving Louisiana's position in virtually every state business climate ranking.

He previously served as policy director of the Baton Rouge Area Chamber, where he directed policy and research activities during the economic recovery from Hurricane Katrina. Under his leadership, the organization's policy team won the top economic development research award in the nation for two consecutive years.

Jason is an outdoor enthusiast and focuses his volunteer service on education and the arts. He has lived, worked, or traveled in more than 40 countries, was selected for the French-American Foundation's Young Leaders Program, the U.S.-Spain Council's Young Leaders Program, the British-American Project, and term membership in the Council on Foreign Relations.

Jason earned a B.S. in Biological Engineering with honors from Louisiana State University, where he was elected speaker of student senate and awarded the Chancellor's Medal for leadership. Having worked in the public and private sectors, his career has taken him from Wall Street to Main Street, and he has expanded economies from Los Angeles/Long Beach to the Mid-Atlantic region.

At FCEDA, Mr. Hoskins has led a team that has secured more than \$3 billion in capital investment across 669 deals working with companies that have announced the creation of more than 48,000 jobs, nearly 7.5 million square feet of commercial office space and more than 1.3 million square feet of data centers. Companies that have announced new locations or expansion in Fairfax County under Mr. Hoskins' leadership include Microsoft, Google, Meta, Amazon Web Services, Volkswagen Group of America, Amentum, Guidehouse, Starkist, Qualtrics, Alarm.com, Hilton, Clark Construction, Blue Origins, V2X and The Aerospace Corporation.

Prior, Mr. Hoskins spearheaded economic development for Arlington (Va.) and brought Amazon HQ2 to Northern Virginia attracting \$4 billion in private capital investment and 37,500 new jobs. Mr. Hoskins also collaborated with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to implement a \$1.5 billion Tech Talent Pipeline program that has resulted in the creation of two tech innovation campuses. As Deputy Mayor of the District of Columbia, Mr. Hoskins' team transformed Washington with projects such as City Center, the Wharf and Union Market.

Mr. Hoskins holds an Honors undergraduate degree from Dartmouth and has held executive leadership positions in real estate in both the public and private sectors. He currently serves on multiple boards including Northern Virginia Economic Development Alliance, Connected DMV, Northern Virginia Chamber of Commerce and Virginia Chamber of Commerce.
